Abstract: Based on deterrence theory, it is possible that the declarations deter crime by increasing the objective and perceptive severity and certainty of punishments and reducing would-be offenders' intention to offend. This study measures the size and duration of deterrent effects of two separate war-on-gang declarations adopted in Taiwan in 2012 and 2014. We performed interrupted time-series analyses to explore the effects of the war-on-gang declarations on monthly crime rates between 2011 and 2018 in a metropolitan city in Taiwan.
